We are seeking a volunteer to help Cambridge City Foodbank realise it's vision of ending the need for food banks by providing administrative support to the Fairbite Food Clubs. Fairbite Food Clubs are a project of Cambridge City Foodbank, delivered in collaborative partnership with community organisations. They provide affordable food to those in need for a small membership fee, as well as a sense of community and support such as financial advice.

As a volunteer Administrative Assistant to the Fairbite Development Manager, you will have previously worked or volunteered in an administrative role, will be familiar with Microsoft Office packages, and will be known as a reliable and trustworthy person.

Our Vision is for a UK without the need for food banks. Each day we meet the need for emergency and affordable food, and tackle the causes of poverty, by harnessing the power of the community. We are an independent local charity and member of the Trussell network.
