### Story of the month (Charmaine Walsh)

Hopefully you've all seen the news by now that the **two-child limit** has been lifted! This is amazing news, and families should feel some of the weight lifted off their shoulders in the coming months.

Currently, **32%** of our parcels are provided to families with three or more children - higher than the Wales average of 28% - so this really will be life changing for the families we support.

Michelle and Joanne have told us about their struggles. Michelle says: "The Foodbank has helped me out so much, and without their support, it would be very hard. They are very helpful and friendly. We are very thankful for all your help and support."

Joanne echoes a similar story: "We're grandparents looking after three young children. We haven't received child benefit for the last year, which has meant we've needed the Foodbank to feed ourselves."

Hopefully, people like Michelle and Joanne will soon have more money in their pockets to help afford the essentials, and fewer children will face hunger and hardship in our community!

#### This month in numbers:

- We distributed 343 food parcels to local people in crisis. That's more than 3,000 meals
- 147 of our parcels went to local children
- We distributed 2878kg of food in the Taff-Ely area
- More than 60 local people volunteered with us
